Board of County Commissioners Meeting December 28, 2009

The Canadian County Board of County Commissioners met at 9:00am in the Public Meeting Room. Those present were Commissioner David Anderson, Commissioner Phil Carson, Acting District #3 Commissioner Troy Boling, County Clerk Shelley Dickerson, County Sheriff Randall Edwards, Election Board Secretary Wanda Armold, Joan South, Jerry Smith, Cliff Lawson, Jim Powell and Jon Watje.

Anderson called the meeting to order.

Carson moved, seconded by Anderson to approve the December 21, 2009 minutes. Voting aye: Anderson, Carson, and Boling.

Carson moved, seconded by Boling to approve appropriations. There were no transfers. Voting aye: Anderson, Carson, and Boling.

There were no comments from the public.

Anderson presented item #5 – Consider approval to go into Executive Session, pursuant to Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes Title 25 § 307B.1. Anderson stated he requested to put this item on the agenda, but there was some discrepancy concerning how the executive session should be presented. He stated the statutes require that executive sessions be entered into in a certain way and he did not think the item was worded correctly on the agenda. Anderson stated items #5, 6, 7, and 8 would be tabled until further notice.

Anderson presented item #9 – Consider approval of Resolution (#09-141) to direct refunds and reimbursements received by the Canadian County Election Board to the General Fund Election Board payroll and maintenance & operations accounts for FY2010-2011. Armold stated when elections are held for other entities such as schools or the state, the Election Board bills those entities for the cost of employee overtime. These reimbursements are deposited into the General Fund and then appropriated to the Election Board's current year budgeted account. Armold further stated that in the past the State Election Board has reimbursed the county for computer equipment or telephones used on Election Day and these reimbursements are also deposited into the General Fund and then appropriated to the budgeted account. Armold stated she had learned from the regional coordinator that one resolution could be approved for both situations. Carson moved, seconded by Boling to approve the resolution. Voting aye: Anderson, Carson, and Boling.

Anderson presented item #10 – Consider approval of Office of Juvenile Affairs Transportation Claim for transportation services provided on 12-07-09 by the Children's Justice Center. South stated staff from the Juvenile Center transported an OJA custody youth for placement and this claim reimburses the county for

staff time and mileage. She further stated that in other counties the County Sheriff may provide the transportation, but in Canadian County it is handled by the Juvenile Bureau officers. Carson moved, seconded by Anderson to approve the claim. Voting aye: Anderson, Carson, and Boling.

Anderson presented item #11 - Consider approval of appointment for County Sheriff's Office for:

Edwards stated five of the deputies were certified and eight of the deputies will attend the Reserve Academy in January to be certified. Edwards stated he wants to build up the reserve program to utilize it as a resource for personnel. It does not cost the county any salaries. The only cost is for the uniform. Edwards stated this allows his office to call for replacements when needed when deputies are gone due to sickness, vacation or bad weather. Carson moved, seconded by Boling to approve the appointments. Voting aye: Anderson, Carson, and Boling.

Anderson asked for new business.

Smith stated the governor declared a state of emergency due to the recent weather. If the threshold is met for the state, emergency funds may be available to the counties for equipment damages, overtime of personnel, or road damages. Smith stated he needed preliminary estimates of damages as soon as possible so that he can get the information to the state. He stated the county threshold is approximately \$300,000.00. Smith asked the Sheriff to calculate the cost of man hours for any reserve deputies that were used during the bad weather.

Edwards stated his dispatch wanted him to be sure to thank the Commissioners for the help they and their districts provided during the bad weather. He stated they were a valuable resource to the Sheriff's Department beginning Christmas Eve and he sincerely thanked the Commissioners for their help.

Smith expressed thanks on behalf of the communities to the Districts for their help with an accident on Highway 152.

Anderson expressed his thanks to the Sheriff and stated the county worked as a team during the bad weather

Also under new business, Anderson explained the executive session concerned the employees' personnel policy. The issue was whether or not an executive session could be held to discuss all employees or if it should be for a specific employee. Anderson asked that an officers meeting be scheduled to discuss the personnel policy and possible updates. Anderson suggested the meeting be scheduled after the officers attend an ACCO workshop concerning personnel policies on January 7. [Clerk's note: The meeting will be scheduled as a Commissioners Special Meeting.]

The Commissioners gave the following reports:

Commissioner Carson stated he attended the Circuit 6 Engineers meeting at Chickasha on Tuesday. Carson stated that after the snow storm the District #1 employees worked together to clear snow, rescue people, and get vehicles out of the snow drifts. Carson commended the employees who put in long hours during the rough conditions.

Commissioner Anderson stated he attended the CED #6 with Carson and C.C. Shah. Wednesday, the District had the shop Christmas party. On Thursday around noon, Anderson received a call from his brother

who was involved in the accident on Highway 152. Anderson stated dozens of cars were stranded between Mustang and Union City. He called the District shop to get assistance for ambulances that were on the scene but were stuck in the snow. Anderson stated that within an hour all three Districts were responding to calls. Anderson said he appreciated the attitude of the employees who worked during the Christmas holiday to help serve others.

Acting Commissioner Boling stated District #3 hauled rock on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The District had the shop Christmas party on Wednesday. Boling stated the rest of the time was spent working with the bad weather. Boling stated he appreciated the work of the employees. Boling also reported the District hauled 138 tons of crusher gyp to Jones, east of Cedar; hauled 69 tons of crusher gyp to Jones, east of Maberry; hauled 69 tons of crusher gyp to Britton, east of Red Rock; hauled 69 tons of crusher gyp to Britton, east of Red Rock; hauled 46 tons of crusher gyp to Red Rock, south of Britton; hauled 23 tons of crusher gyp to Maberry, south of Memorial; hauled 31.35 tons of crusher gyp to stock; hauled 253 tons of crusher run to 122nd, east of Ranch; and hauled 69 tons of crusher run to Maberry, south of 122nd. The District also installed a 28"x20"x40" pipe on Karns and a 30"x30" stop sign at Red Rock and Britton.

Carson moved, seconded by Boling to approve Blanket Purchase Orders. Voting aye: Anderson, Carson, and Boling.
