~BID REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS~

BIDDERS LIST:

- A. Vendors wishing to do business with the County should be included on the "Bidders List" maintained by the County Purchasing Agent. All vendors are eligible for consideration.
- B. Vendors wishing to be added to the "Bidders List" should contact the County Purchasing Office.
- C. Removal from the "Bidders List".
 1. Removal or Suspension. The Purchasing Agent may remove any vendor on the Bidders List for such period of time deemed necessary by the Purchasing Agent.
 2. Cause for Removal or Suspension. The following shall be deemed sufficient grounds for removal or suspension:
 - a) Three consecutive failures to respond to the Notice to Bidders.
 - b) Failure to submit certificate of compliance when required.
 - c) Consistent failure to conform to bid regulations, conditions, and/or specifications.
 - d) Failure to make timely deliveries.
 - e) Failure to keep bid firm for the time specified on the Notice of Bid.
 - f) Collusion with other bidders or prospective bidders to restrain competitive bidding.
 - g) Bankruptcy or other evidence of insolvency of the bidder.
 - h) Giving false or misleading information in an application for inclusion of the "Bidders List".
 - i) Any violation of these rules and regulations or other information suggesting that the bidder is no longer responsible and qualified to do business with the County.
 3. Notice of removal or suspension from the Bidders List will be sent to affected vendor. This action may be contested in writing to the Purchasing Agent within five working days.

BIDDING PROCEDURES:

- A. Solicitation of Bids.
 1. Concerning Solicitation. The Purchasing Agent provides fair and impartial consideration to all qualified bidders and seeks to obtain the highest practicable degree of full and free competition. All interested vendors are urged to apply for inclusion on the Bidders List.
 2. Bid Selection. The County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any or all bids or award all or any portion of the items bid including awarding by districts on any items bid. The Purchasing Agent will solicit phone bids from three or more vendors selected at random, if this occurs.
- B. Bid Form:
 1. Bids are submitted on the forms containing items and/or goods a vendor wished to bid. Return of bid constitutes a valid offer good for 30 days from the date of opening.
 2. Formal Requirements.
 - a) Written in Ink or Typewritten. All bids must be written legibly in ink or preferably typewritten.
 - b) Authorized Signature. The bid must bear the signature in ink by the person so authorized.
 - c) Notary Seal. Each bid must bear the signature and seal of an authorized Notary Public on the Affidavit of Non-Collusion.
 - d) Labeled and sealed envelope. Bidders name and address and closing date must appear on the face of the envelope.



HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT:

All bidders shall defend, indemnify and hold the County of Canadian County, State of Oklahoma, its commissioners, officers, deputies and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorney's fees), or claims for injury or damages arising from, relating to, or connected with the performance of the bidding work.

BID CONTENTS:

1. **Entire Agreement.** The Bid Regulations and Conditions of this section together with the Notice of Bid and any other sheets or documents made a part of the bid package, shall constitute the entire agreement between parties.
2. **Modification.** An addendum will be issued, when deemed necessary, for any changes in, additions to, or waivers of specifications, or regulations and conditions of the bid. The Purchasing Agent must issue this addendum.
3. **Offer firm for thirty days.** Return of bid constitutes a valid offer guaranteed for a minimum of 30 days by vendor until bid is awarded. After bid is awarded offer is firm for six months.
4. **Items to be new or current.** Unless otherwise stated within the bid, goods and materials offered in the bid are to be new and of current design.
5. **Non-Acceptance of Split Award – “All or None Bid”** – The County Commissioners reserve the right to make and award on items or groups of items listed on the bid. If the vendor wishes to bid “All or None”, this must be clearly shown of the bid.
6. **Shipping Instructions.** Goods and materials are to be shipped F.O.B., the receiving officer or department. All freight is to be borne by the vendor and included in the bid price.
7. **Title and Risk of Loss.** Title of goods shall not pass from the vendor until such goods are received by requisitioning departments receiving officer. Risk of such loss prior to such receipt shall be borne by the vendor.
8. **Delivery.** Time is of the essence and deliveries are to be made within ten days after receipt of an order. Items to be picked up by the County shall be ready within 24 hours of notice.
9. **Inspection and Rejection.** All goods and materials shall be subject to inspection by the receiving officer at the time of delivery. Any goods not in complete conformance with the specifications, defective in materials of workmanship, or found to contain latent defects will be rejected. Such goods are to be removed and replaced by and at the cost of the vendor promptly after notifications of rejection. Risk or loss as to such rejected goods shall be borne by the vendor.
10. **Payment.** Payment by the County for goods received shall not constitute acceptance if subsequent discoveries reveal latent defects or a failure to meet bid specifications. Payment for a period delivery shall not be deemed acceptance of undelivered goods.
11. **Exemption from Taxes.** Purchases made by the County are exempt from State Sales Tax and from Federal Excise Tax. These taxes should not be included in bid prices. When required, the Purchasing Agent will supply the proper tax exemption certificate.

SUBMISSION PROCEDURES:

- A. **Sealed envelopes.** Bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the name and address of the vendor and date and time of closing clearly marked on the outside of the envelope.
- B. **Late Bids.** Bids received after the time and date of closing listed on Notice to Bidders will not be opened. These late bids will remain unopened and become a permanent part of the bid file.



AWARDING OF BIDS:

- A. Acceptance. The Purchasing Agent will compile the bids submitted. The County Commissioners will open and award all bids. The Purchasing Agent will notify all successful bidders in writing prior to onset of the bidding period. **Vendors should not submit bids for items that are not on the six month bid request. Bids will be awarded only for items on the six month bid request.**

Purchases of items and supplies that are on this Six Month Bid list must be made from the vendor listed. This is an exclusive contract between Canadian County and the vendor for the time period mentioned on the "NOTICE TO BIDDERS". The county must be as sincere in fulfilling its obligation by buying from the vendor as it expects the vendor to be in holding the price stable to the bid period.

B. Grounds for Rejection:

1. Non-Responsive Bid. Any bid which does not meet the requirements or specifications of the bid, or is unsuitable for the intended use, or does not comply with these regulations and conditions may be rejected. The County Commissioners reserve the right to reject any or all bids when such is deemed in the best interest of the County.
2. Affidavit. The Non-Collusion Affidavit not signed and notarized and/or included with the bid.

PERFORMANCE BY SUCCESSFUL BIDDER:

A. Delivery of Goods:

1. Deliveries shall be made within ten days from the date ordered. Items to be picked up by the County shall be ready within 24 hours of Notice.
2. Deliveries are to be made to the requisitioning department and the vendor will be advised of such time of order.

SUB-LETTING:

- A. Any bid submitted with sub-letting to firm other than the bidding vendor will or shall be CLEARLY SPECIFIED ON THE BID SHEET.

THE USE OF RECYCLED MATERIALS:

- A. If a vendor has products using recyclable materials and regular materials, the vendor shall submit separate bids, using one bid for recyclable materials only and using one bid for regular materials.

CHANGING OF BID SPECIFICATIONS:

- A. Bid forms shall be filled out as specified. If a Vendor chooses to change the bid specifications, the bid will be subject to rejection by the Board of Canadian County Commissioners.

ALUMINIZED STEEL TYPE "2" PIPE SPECIFICATIONS:

- A. This proposal for furnishing Corrugated Aluminized Steel Type "2" Pipe as per Oklahoma State Highway Specifications, Section 726, 1999 Edition and Supplements, delivered F.O.B. to specified locations in Canadian County. Steel Sheet, aluminum-coated (type 2) by the hot-dip process for sewer and drainage pipe shall conform to the AASHTO M 274.

Cement:

All Cement for soil stabilization shall meet the following:

Standard Specifications for: Portland Cement (ASTM C150 or AASHTO M85) or

Standard Specification for: Blended Hydraulic Cement (AASHTO C595 or AASHTO M240) or

Standard Specification for: Hydraulic Cement (ASTM C 1157)

Delivery of cement shall be made in Pneumatic trailers equipped with spreader bars that spread the material uniformly on the roadway. The cost of spreading the cement shall be included in the delivered cost of the material. Must meet current ODOT specifications.

Fly ash:

Fly ash should conform to AASHTO M295 Class C or Class F materials. No bottom ash or Fly ash that is not approved by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation will be accepted. Delivery of the material shall be quoted in end dump trucks with an alternate price delivered in a pneumatic trailer and spread with a spreader bar. Must meet current ODOT specifications.

Lime:

Lime shall be quick lime in accordance with AASHTO M 216 with an available lime index of at least 90% as per ASTM C 25. Only quicklime from sources approved by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation will be allowed. Hydrated lime will not be allowed. Lime shall be delivered in bottom drop pneumatic trailers. Must meet current ODOT specifications.

Cement Kiln Dust:

Cement Kiln Dust being a byproduct of the manufacture of cement should conform to the following specifications: When Tested by AASHTO T 405 the lower limits of the average of chemical properties of the material should meet or exceed the following specifications for one month before shipment. Must meet current ODOT specifications.

CKD Requirements

Calcium Oxides = greater than 35%

Alkali Equivalents = less than 8%

Total Sulfates = less than 10%

Loss on Ignition test = less than 30%

The vendor shall provide current tests report before shipment of the material to the county. Delivery of the material shall be quoted in end dump trucks with an alternate price delivered in a pneumatic trailer and spread with a spreader bar.

All vendors shall supply the name and contact information of a customer service representative to assist with installation questions and installation specifications for the materials quoted.

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CEMENT SLURRY FOR SOIL STABILIZATION

\$ _____ DRY/TON

SPECS FOR CEMENT SLURRY:

DESCRIPTION

This material shall be delivered and applied into or onto the subgrade soil by the supplier at the specified rate determined by the County. Prior to delivery and application, the Supplier may be required to provide cement samples for laboratory testing to be mixed with native subgrade soil from the project site. The County will perform the required work to prepare the subgrade soil for application of the cement slurry, mix the cement slurry into the soil and perform the final shaping and compaction of the cement slurry modified subgrade soil.

MATERIALS

Cement shall conform to the requirements of ASTM C150/150M. Cement powder being used for slurry shall be stored in a weatherproof storage unit to prevent lumps, caking of cement and contamination of any foreign matter that may be deleterious to slurry mix.

The slurry mix shall contain a minimum of 55% cementitious material by mass.

The slurry mix shall contain a stabilizing agent capable of maintaining a homogenous mixture of cementitious material, in water, for a minimum of four hours after it has been batched.

MATERIAL TESTING

If tested, a 500 ml portion of the slurry will be removed from the middle of the load. The slurry suspension will be monitored with no vibration or agitation at ambient temperature for 30 minutes. Little or no separation of liquid or solid should occur. The Marsh Funnel Viscosity of the slurry shall be a minimum of 60 seconds when measured according to ASTM D6910

EQUIPMENT

The slurry plant shall be a hydraulic/pneumatic mixing plant with monitoring devices to regulate flow rates and line pressures. Slurry proportion shall be regulated by calibrated scales. All components of the slurry solution shall be mixed using a high energy static mixing apparatus. All mechanical mixing must be pump driven. Lime slaking tanks, paddle driven mixers and other similar technology shall not be employed.

The slurry plant should provide safe and easy access for the Engineer to obtain samples.

The cement slurry shall be delivered to the project site in a non-baffle tank vehicle that does not recirculate or agitate the slurry material by any means other than the motion of the vehicle in normal movement.

Application of the cement slurry shall be uniformly placed onto or into substrate soil. The vehicle that places the slurry shall spread a controlled slurry within a given area. Tickets shall be generated through the function of calibrated plant scales for the amount (per ton) of dry cementitious product delivered to the project site.

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

Cement slurry for soil stabilization shall be measured by the dry ton of cement delivered and applied to the subgrade soil and shall include cement samples for laboratory testing. The County shall provide the supplier with water for slurry vehicle, tankers and an area to clean slurry vehicle.


