

January 28, 2002

After the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of January 14, 2002, and there being no additions or corrections, Denise Heavner moved that the minutes be approved. Bill Graves seconded the motion.

Kerrie Hudson stated that Deanna Fogleman with Nutrition Aging Services at 329 S. Peters has asked for help to deliver meals. This can be done during lunch hours and it takes about 30 to 40 minutes to deliver 5 to 6 meals.

Bill Graves stated that he had heard of new legislation that is a house bill that would reduce all public officials pay by 10%.

Denise Heavner asked if she could have the number of that bill because she could not find it.

Leroy Krohmer stated that would be a good bill if the public officials could fix the legislatures salary also.

Denise stated there are a lot of bills about the Assessor's Office. They are about exemptions, and freezes of valuation and that would affect the whole county. Some of them would be going into effect next year and would basically take away all of the county's growth. More discussion took place as far as valuations and how it would affect schools, city and towns and that they need to get involved.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Leroy Krohmer moved that the meeting be adjourned. Bill Graves seconded the motion.
