## March 6, 2006

Jim Helm stated that many of the recommendations made by the jail committee had been adopted by the Commissioners. Mr. Helm said there were some interim measurers, such as electronic monitoring, which is being established for prisoners that are eligible to be released. The County has adopted that. The Commissioners have looked at the remodeling of the activities room in the jail. The Commissioners authorized a study to determine the cost. Another interim measure that the committee had suggested was double and triple celling, subject to the health department standards, and that has already been implemented. Continuing to contract with other jurisdictions for bed space as needed and that is still under consideration. The Committee feels that the Commissioners are acting upon many of the recommendations that were made. An architect has been hired. Mr. Helms stated he made these points because these might be items that are included in the letter that goes to the Health Department this month to note that progress is being made toward the ultimate goal of getting a jail built. Also meetings with the Judges to determine ways that cases could be expedited to reduce the time an inmate is held awaiting trail. Mr. Helms feels it is important that the Public and the Health Department know that the County is moving ahead.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Leroy Krohmer moved that the meeting be adjourned. Mark Meyer seconded the motion. The vote was: Leroy Krohmer, yes; Mark Meyer, yes. Motion carried.
