The regular scheduled meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was called to order this 23rd day of July, 2007, in the conference room of the Cleveland County Office Building by Chairman George Skinner. Roll was called by Tammy Howard, County Clerk/Secretary and those present were:

Chairman Skinner began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

After the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of July 16, 2007, and there being no additions or corrections, Rusty Sullivan moved that the minutes be approved. George Skinner seconded the motion.

Chairman Skinner called for discussion, consideration, and/or action on the Jail Report from Neil Vickers.

Mr. Vickers stated during this reporting period the average population per day of the Cleveland County Detention Center was 199 prisoners. During this week the City of Norman averaged 7 municipal prisoners per day and the City of Moore averaged 4 prisoners per day. During this week's period the Sheriff's Office transported 9 prisoners to other jurisdictions after hearings were conducted in the Cleveland County Court System. District judges released seven prisoners held for court costs and fines only after new terms were set. Six prisoners sentenced to prison time were transported to the Department of Corrections or other jurisdictions. There are presently 27 defendants placed on electronic monitoring. During this past weekend from Friday until Monday morning, 71 people were arrested and booked into the detention center. Of the 71, 50 were held on state charges and 21 on municipal charges. On Monday morning, 27 of the 71 arrested remained in jail—19 on state charges and 8 on municipal charges. Of the 71 arrested, 35 were held on alcohol related charges. The detention center presently has one prisoner arrested in 2005. Seven have been held since 2006. The remainder, numbering over 210, was arrested during the past seven months. Mr. Vickers will continue to monitor the jail population and make recommendations as he can.
