August 20, 2007

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was called to order this 20th day of August, 2007, in the conference room of the Cleveland County Office Building by Chairman George Skinner. Roll was called by Tammy Howard, County Clerk/Secretary and those present were:

George Skinner, Chairman Rusty Sullivan, Vice-Chairman Rod Cleveland, Member Tammy Howard, Secretary

Chairman Skinner began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

After the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of August 13, 2007, and there being no additions or corrections, Rod Cleveland moved that the minutes be approved. Rusty Sullivan seconded the motion.

The vote was: George Skinner, yes; Rusty Sullivan, yes; Rod Cleveland, yes. Motion carried.

George Skinner moved, seconded by Rusty Sullivan, to award County Bid #COM2-1342 – Cleveland County District #2 selling bridge timbers by sealed bid, to Silver Star Construction.

Upon the recommendation of Brenda Wakeman, Assistant Purchasing Agent, Rusty Sullivan moved, seconded by Rod Cleveland, to award County Bid #HWY-1341 – Six-Month (6) Non-Encumbered Contract to provide asphalt material per the bid summary and where the low bid was not awarded there is an explanation by the item. The bid term will be from the bid award date through six-months (6).

Chairman Skinner called for discussion, consideration, and/or action on the Jail Report from Neil Vickers.

Mr. Vickers stated during this reporting period of August 9, 2007 through August 15, 2007 the average population per day of the Cleveland County Detention Center was 225 prisoners. During this week the City of Norman averaged 4 municipal prisoners per day and the City of Moore averaged 4 prisoners per day. During this week's period the Sheriff's Office transported 10 prisoners to other jurisdictions after hearings were conducted in the Cleveland County Court System. Six prisoners convicted in our court system were transported to the Department of Corrections or other jurisdictions after receiving prison time. District Judges released five prisoners held for court costs and fines only after new terms were set. There are presently 26 defendants placed on electronic monitoring. During this past weekend from Friday until Monday morning, 80 people were arrested and booked into the Detention Center. Of the 80, 59 were held on state charges and 21 on municipal charges. On Monday morning,

34 of the 80 arrested remained in jail. Of the 80 arrested, 36 were held on alcohol related charges.

Twenty-four of those presently in jail have been convicted to serve prison time with the Department of Corrections and are in various stages to be transported. Thirty-two prisoners in the detention center are serving sentences of county jail time. Mr. Vickers will continue to monitor the jail population and make recommendations as he can. Mr. Vickers also wanted to add to his report there are currently 28 prisoners being held at the Pottawatomie County Jail.

George Skinner moved to accept. Rod Cleveland seconded the motion. The vote was: George Skinner, yes; Rusty Sullivan, yes; Rod Cleveland, yes. Motion carried.

Rusty Sullivan moved, seconded by Rod Cleveland, to approve the Resolution that will serve as an agreement between the Cleveland County Board of County Commissioners and Central Oklahoma Community Action Agency, the purpose of such agreement is to acknowledge continued support between these two organizations as they serve the needy citizens of Cleveland County in the amount of \$10,000.00 (\$833.33 per month), for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1st, 2007 and ending June 30th, 2008. Aid is to include, but not limited to, the County Indigent Burial Program as well as for any other emergencies provided by law. Chairman Skinner called for miscellaneous discussion.

Ms. Norma Sapp addressed the Board concerning a female inmate in the Cleveland County Jail that was arrested for drug charges and her personal items being seized, such as her vehicle, causing a hardship for this inmate. Ms. Sapp also stated when this female inmate is released she will have nothing left and is concerned about how this inmate will be able to do the things the Drug Court will ask of her. Ms. Sapp went on to say she was not here to talk about this particular inmate, but to talk about the jail overcrowding not only in this County, but all over the State of Oklahoma, being expensive and passing different drug laws to help with this type of situation. She encouraged the Board as citizens to speak up against this problem.

Chairman Skinner responded by stating the County Commissioners are not responsible or have any say about who is in jail and who is out with monitoring bracelets, that is up to the Judges and the District Attorney's Office.

Ms. Sapp stated she understood that and thanked the Board for listening to her.

Chairman Skinner asked if there was any other miscellaneous discussion.

Mr. Bobby Stevens addressed the Board concerning several items. Mr. Stevens stated he felt the new County Jail should be built in the next block south of the Courthouse with a tunnel underneath the street. Mr. Stevens also asked why the Sheriff's Office could not do accident reports? Mr. Stevens stated in his opinion there should be EMS station on the east side of Norman and asked what the EMS response time was out east? Mr. Stevens also asked if the County was allowed to work road blocks and how many roadblocks has the County work? Mr. Stevens went on to ask about two intersections and why they could not be four-way

stops, one at 120th and Maguire Road and the second one at 36th and Cedar Lane? Mr. Stevens thanked the Board for listening to him.

Chairman Skinner responded by stating the Commissioners had hired a Jail Expert and he stated if the Commissioners built the jail on the South side of the Courthouse it would have to be a 17-story building to hold five hundred beds.

Mr. Stevens asked if they could go down instead of up?

Chairman Skinner responded that would be more expensive to go down. Mr. Skinner also stated the County does not have any say so with the EMS, that the EMS comes out of the Norman Hospital and he would check with them for Mr. Stevens on the response time. Mr. Skinner went on to say there was a Traffic Study done on the intersection of 120th and Maguire Road and the Study suggested the County not make the intersection a four-way stop. Mr. Skinner stated he would let the Sheriff's Department answer the questions regarding the Accident Reports and Road Blocks.

Sheriff DeWayne Beggs stated the State Statutes require the Highway Patrol to do the Accident Reports and Mr. Stevens would have to request from his office the numbers on the Road Blocks.

Chairman Skinner also stated the other intersection in question; Mr. Stevens would have to contact the City of Noble.

Mr. Stevens then asked about the mowing issue with all the signs being blocked out? Chairman Skinner stated after the Little Axe Meeting, he drove out there and did not see any signs that could not be seen.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Rusty Sullivan moved, that the meeting be adjourned. Rod Cleveland seconded the motion.
