Chairman Skinner called for the presentation of Certificate of Appreciation for the Retirement of Lahoma Nelson, Community Relations Deputy for the Cleveland County Sheriff's Office effective October 31, 2007. Rod Cleveland read the following in honor of Ms. Lahoma Nelson: Lahoma Nelson began with the Cleveland County Sheriff's Office on August 8, 1988 after spending 30-years at the Norman Police Department. Ms. Nelson was the Community Relations Deputy dealing mainly with elementary school children; teaching them about safety and being aware of strangers and other hazards our children are sometimes faced with. In 1977, Lahoma was the Community Relations Officer at the Norman Police Department. Ms. Nelson worked with Sooner Fashion Mall to create Safety Town, which is still in operation each summer and she still continues to help out with Safety Town each year. Another interesting fact is that Sheriff Beggs was Ms. Nelson's training officer when she

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attended the Norman Police Academy in 1972. Throughout the years, Ms. Nelson has literally touched the lives of so many young people. Some of you here today may have participated in Safety Town or Ms. Nelson may have visited your school. Anyone who ever met Ms. Nelson will always remember her from being a Sunday School Teacher to teaching Safety Classes. After 19 years, Ms. Nelson will officially retire on Wednesday, October 31, 2007 and will be honored with a reception at the Sheriff's Office from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Chairman Skinner and Rusty Sullivan also praised Ms. Nelson for all of her service. Ms. Nelson stated she has always enjoyed coming to work and thanked everyone. Chairman Skinner, Rusty Sullivan and Rod Cleveland presented Ms. Nelson with a Certification of Appreciation in her honor.
