Darry Stacy moved, seconded by Harold Haralson, to accept and award the low quote of \$37,449.00 by Sun Construction Services to remodel the exterior existing AG Building at the Cleveland County Fairgrounds. Quotes were received from Apollo Building Systems, Inc., and the low quote of \$37,449.00 by Sun Construction Services. LG Construction was not able to bid at this time.

Travel related to training for instructional assistants will be billed at a rate of \$0.575 per mile and shall not exceed costs authorized by the State Travel Reimbursement Act. The contract shall not exceed \$30,000 per program year and will run from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016.

The contract shall not exceed \$30,000 per program year for the period July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Cleveland County, Oklahoma, do find that the aforementioned conditions constitute a threat to the safety and welfare of the county, and create an emergency disaster situation within the meaning of Title 63 Section 683 et seq., Oklahoma Emergency Management Act of 2003, as amended:

NOW THEREFORE, The Board of County Commissioners of Cleveland County, Oklahoma, acting under the power vested in me under Title 63 Section 683 et seq., Oklahoma Emergency Management Act of 2003, do hereby declare Cleveland County to be a disaster area, entitled to aid, relief and assistance and do hereby direct the implementation of the County Emergency Operations Plan.

Cleveland County Officials:

As a result of the recent flooding, this office has been asked by numerous county officials, including county commissioners on separate occasions, regarding the county's ability to assist the citizens of Cleveland County with repairs to either private roads or private drives. While I understand the county's desire to render such assistance, I have advised previously, and continue to advise that such actions undertaken by the county on private property, regardless of the circumstances, is illegal and cannot occur. While I understand that this is not going to be well received or a popular opinion, it should be made clear that public officials are the stewards of tax payer dollars which must be expended on county owned roads and bridges as opposed to private property.

I anticipate that the question will be posed regarding what steps would be necessary in order to allow such expenditures to occur. In this regard, I've advised that the only way to effectively allow county employees and/or officials to assist Cleveland County citizens on private property would require a change in the law authorizing these actions. As it stands today, such actions as indicated above, are not authorized.
