

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MINUTES

MONDAY, AUGUST 17, 2020

This Regular meeting was conducted in accordance with 25 O.S §306 (C) (Signed and enacted March 18, 2020). The meeting took place in the Board of County Commissioners Meeting Room and through teleconference. Public comment was made calling (405)366-0200 to be added to the list.

Sheriff Blake Green led in the prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Darry Stacy called to order the regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Cleveland County Commissioners at 1:00 P.M. this 17th day of August 2020, in Meeting Room 200 of the Cleveland County Office Building. Linda Atkins, Deputy County Clerk/Secretary, called the roll and those present were:

B. Old Business:

1. Upon the recommendation of Susan Reese, Darry Stacy moved, seconded by Harold Haralson, to table until a later date the awarding and/or rejecting of bids for Bid #HWY-1957 – Six month (6) Non-Encumbered Contract for Tires and Tubes. The bid term will be from September 5, 2020 through March 4, 2021.

The vote was: Darry Stacy, yes; Rod Cleveland, yes; Harold Haralson, yes. Motion carried.

C. Items of Business:

1. George Mauldin, Emergency Management Director, presented the follow COVID-19 Updates and Operations within Cleveland County:

As of today, there are 3,215 (3,017) confirmed cases in Cleveland County with 58 (55) deaths. This is an increase of 198 (292) cases with three additional deaths since the last weekly update on August 10, 2020.

There were 1,559 (1,477) cases in Norman with 31 deaths. This is an increase of 82 (122) cases with no additional deaths since the last weekly update on August 10, 2020.

The rate of growth in new cases has declined. We averaged 86 new cases per day during the last week of July, 45 new cases per day during the first week of August, and 30 new cases per day during the second week of August.

Deaths continue increase slightly but have remained relatively low, with 58 deaths recorded in the past week statewide (54 at last update).

Preliminary data indicate that there have been only three weeks with excess deaths recorded thus far in 2020 in Oklahoma. Contrast that with six weeks of excess deaths recorded in January and February of 2018.

Hospitalizations remain high but have decreased since my last report. As of August 14, there were 426 individuals hospitalized with COVID-19 (221 in the ICU). This is an increase of 7 since my last weekly report (August 7 report, 419 hospitalizations with 204 in the ICU). Hospitals are not in danger of being overwhelmed. There are 21% of ICU beds available and 20% medical/surgery beds available.

As of August 13, Cleveland County is in the "low risk" category on the COVID-19 Alert System with 9.10 cases per 100,000 populations (13.64 on August 10). The threshold for the "moderate risk category is 14.39. There are 27 counties in the moderate risk category, up from 23 and one county (Beaver) in the normal risk category, the same as the previous week. The remaining 49 counties are in the low risk category.

Pittsburg County has the highest number of cases per 100,000 at 45.81.

The numbers used in the COVID-19 Alert System are based on a 7 day rolling average of new cases.

On August 13, 2020, Commissioner of Health Lance Frye issued a Public Health Advisory. There were a number of recommendations outlined in the advisory including:

- 1. Public and private entities should increase testing capacity.
- 2. OSDH should continue to develop its data collection system
- 3. Individuals ages 11 and older in a moderate or high risk county should wear a face covering when:
- a. Inside a business, public building or other indoor place open to the public
- b. In an outdoor public space whenever it is not feasible to maintain six feet of social distance
- c. Using public transportation
- 4. It is recommended that visitors to nursing homes, long-term care facilities, retirement homes, medical facilities, prisons or other communal living facilities in all counties wear a face covering
- 5. It is recommended that all teachers and other essential school personnel wear a face covering.
- 6. Restaurant staff in moderate or high risk counties should wear a face covering.
- 7. Individuals entering Oklahoma from areas of substantial community spread should wear a face covering when in a business or other public building and outdoor public spaces when six feet social distance cannot be maintained
- 8. It is recommended that long-term care facilities test for COVID-19 weekly.

Recommendations

Mr. Mauldin recommended continuing to follow the CDC guidelines on social distancing, sanitation and hygiene and follow the recommendations in the Public Health Advisory issued by Commissioner Frye.

Commissioner Haralson said that there is a new saliva test for the virus that can be completed in just a few hours.

George Mauldin said that is correct and it has a high degree of accuracy.

Chairman Darry Stacy said that the following item numbers, 2 through 6, are Consent Items and are routine in nature: Rod Cleveland moved, seconded by Harold Haralson, to approve the consent items.

- 2. Resolution establishing and declaring the official intent of Cleveland County to reimburse the funds of said County for preliminary capital expenditures incurred in the design, constructing and equipping of renovations and expansions to the Alan J. Couch Juvenile Detention Center out of a portion of the proceeds of the Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2020, to be issued by the Cleveland County Justice Facilities Authority on behalf of the County
- **3. Agreement** between Cleveland County Board of County Commissioners and Purple Wave Auction effective July 2020 through June 2021.
- 4. Approve the July 2020 Monthly Reports of the following Officers:
 - a. Bryant Rains, County Election Board Secretary
 - **b.** Tammy Belinson, County Clerk
 - c. Jim Reynolds, County Treasurer
 - d. Douglas Warr, County Assessor
 - e. Marilyn Williams, Court Clerk
 - f. Blake Green, County Sheriff
 - g. Jackie Kanak, Health Department
- 5. Review, Audit, and Approve or Disallow Blanket Purchase Orders submitted. A report will be available for distribution at the meeting or may be obtained from the County Clerk.
- 6. Review, Audit, and Approve or Disallow claims for Payment of Personal Services, Travel, Maintenance & Operations, and Capital Outlay. A report will be available for distribution at the meeting or may be obtained from the County Clerk.

The vote was: Rod Cleveland, yes; Harold Haralson, yes; Darry Stacy, yes. Motion carried.

- E. No Commissioner's discussions concerning County Business at this time.
- F. Lazaro Ecenarro made Public Comment concerning COVID19 and challenged everyone to do their research as far as medications to treat the virus, and advised to research the accuracy of the testing and statistics.
