



**BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
MINUTES
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 13, 2020**

This Regular meeting was conducted in accordance with 25 O.S §306 (C) (Signed and enacted March 18, 2020). The meeting took place in the Board of County Commissioners Meeting Room and through teleconference. Public comment was made by calling (405)366-0200 to be added to the list.

Commissioner Darry Stacy led in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Darry Stacy called to order the regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Cleveland County Commissioners at 1:00 P.M. this 13th day of October 2020, in Meeting Room 200 of the Cleveland County Office Building. After the reading of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 5, 2020 and Emergency Meeting of October 8, 2020, and there being no additions or corrections, Harold Haralson moved, seconded by Darry Stacy, to **approve** the minutes as read. 1. C. Items of Business:

1. Commissioner Darry Stacy presented an **award** to John Zedeker for challenges he met in preparing for this year's County Fair. The Fair was modified to focus on safety while allowing the children that have worked so hard on their projects to participate. Leading up to the event is busiest time for the Fairground Staff. This year almost everyone in the Fairground workforce tested positive for COVID-19. One week before the fair, two out of the three maintenance workers tested positive. It left one person to ensure that everything was ready in time, John Zedeker took charge and thwarted a

potential catastrophic situation and turned it into a modified fair that the young exhibitors and their families will never forget.

2. **During Pre-Trial presentation**, Carrie Davis introduced Catie Byrd, Pre-Trial Coordinator, who is taking over her position and Kyle Keller, Community Service Coordinator. Carrie Davis presented reports for September 2020.
3. George Mauldin, Emergency Management Director, presented the following **COVID-19 Updates and Operations within Cleveland County**. As of today, there are 7,168 (6,535) confirmed cases in Cleveland County with 83 (75) deaths. This is an increase of 633 (473) cases with eight additional deaths since the last weekly update on October 5.

There are 3,765 (3,471) cases in Norman with 41 (39) deaths. This is an increase of 294 (225) cases with two additional deaths since the last weekly update on October 5, 2020.

There are 905 (858) active cases in Cleveland County, an increase of 47 (21) and 426 (403) active cases in Norman, an increase of 23 (-19).

The number of deaths has increased in the past week with 53 deaths recorded statewide down from 48 at last update. There were five (six) deaths recorded in Cleveland County during the past week.

Hospitalizations are also up. As of October 12, there were 691 individuals hospitalized with COVID-19 (266 in the ICU). This is an increase of 126 (69) since my last weekly report (October 5, 565 hospitalizations with 206 in the ICU). The seven day rolling average is 636, 95 from 541 on October 5.

Hospitals are not in danger of being overwhelmed but available resources have decreased slightly. There are 11% of ICU beds available down from 14% last week, and 21% of medical/surgery beds available, the same as last week.

As of October 8, Cleveland County is in the “orange” or moderate risk category with 23.5 new cases per 100,000 population, up from 21.1 on October 1.

Noble County is in the normal (green) category with no new cases reported. Six (15) counties in the low (yellow) category and the remaining 70 (62) counties are in the moderate (orange) category.

Roger Mills County has the highest rate in the state with 63.8 new cases per 100,000 population. Roger Mills County has a population of 3,583 and a total of 78 cases with only 3 new cases in the past week.

As of October 1, there were a cumulative total of 2,736 (2,574 on 9/25) cases and 13 deaths in correctional facilities including prisons, jails and juvenile

detention centers. Of these, 2,301 cases and 11 deaths were among inmates, the remaining 435 cases and 2 deaths were staff members.

As of October 13, there were 23 (17) inmates and 5 (6) staff members with active infection in the Lexington prisons.

At present, we have 36 inmates who have tested positive for COVID-19 in our jail, down from 43 last week.

Classen Urgent Care began performing rapid PCR tests on August 31. Since that date, they have performed 4,160 rapid tests, of which 686 were positive. This is a positivity rate of 16.49% (16.75%).

National Comparison: (all states + DC)

Total number of reported COVID-19 cases:

Oklahoma ranked 25th California is highest, Vermont is lowest.

Cumulative reported cases per 100,000 population:

Oklahoma ranked 17th down from 16th last week, Louisiana is highest, Vermont is lowest.

Total deaths:

Oklahoma ranked 33rd (1023), California is highest; Alaska and Vermont are tied for lowest.

Death rate (per 100,000):

Oklahoma is ranked 38th down from 38th last week, New Jersey is highest and Alaska is the lowest.

- 8. **Review, Audit, and Approve or Disallow** claims for Payment of Personal Services, Travel, Maintenance & Operations, and Capital Outlay. A report will be available for distribution at the meeting or may be obtained from the County Clerk.
