

# BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MINUTES

### MONDAY, DECEMBER 14, 2020

## Commissioner Rod Cleveland led in prayer and the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Vice-Chairman Rod Cleveland called to order the regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Cleveland County Commissioners at 1:00 P.M. this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December 202, in Meeting Room 200 of the Cleveland County Office Building. Linda Atkins, Deputy County/Secretary, called the roll and those present were:

#### C. Items of Business:

1. George Mauldin, Emergency Management Director, presented the following COVID-19 Updates and Operations within Cleveland County.

As of today, there are 15,743 (14,428) confirmed cases in Cleveland County with 138 (132) deaths. This is an increase of 1,315 (1,450) cases with six additional deaths since the last Monday.

There are 7,985 (7,434) cases in Norman with 78 (75) deaths. This is an increase of 551 (719) cases with three additional deaths since the last weekly update on December 7, 2020.

There are 2,156 (2,071) active cases in Cleveland County, an increase of 85 (93) and 999 (1,039) active cases in Norman, a decrease of 40 (+12) since last Monday.

The number of new cases in Oklahoma continues to increase. The current 7 day average of new cases in Oklahoma is 3,054. In Cleveland County the 7 day average of new cases is 188.

New cases are increasing in 23 other states as well.

The number of deaths has decreased slightly in the past week with 161 (168) deaths recorded statewide, seven fewer than the previous week (+74).

Hospitalizations are at an all-time high. As of December 11, there were 1,614 individuals hospitalized with COVID-19 with 448 in the ICU. The seven day rolling average is 1,639, up 22 (27) since last week.

ICU availability is near an all-time low, there are 4% (39 of 1,014) of ICU beds available up from 3% last week. Available medical/surgery beds available have increased from 11% last week to 12% (720 of 5,923).

As of December 10, all seventy seven counties are in the moderate (orange) category. Cleveland County had 74.0 new cases per 100,000 population, up from 50.6 on December 3.

The number of new cases per 100,000 has decreased in 16 counties. The remaining 61 counties experienced increased numbers of new cases.

Alfalfa County has the highest rate in the state with 425.4 new cases per 100,000 population. Alfalfa County has a population of 5,702 and a total of 685 cases with 158 new cases in the past week.

## Red trigger:

The county is located in a Region where COVID19 patients represent 40% or more of staffed beds (Acute Care OSDH licensed facilities)

Percent of beds that are COVID-19 positive by region:

Region 1 (northwest) -25.7 (24.3% last week)

Region 2 (northeast) -31.3% (28.0% last week)

Region 3 (southwest) – 29.0% (28.3% last week)

Region 4 (east central) -12.8% (12.0% last week)

Region 5 (southeast) -17.9% (16.7% last week)

Region 6 (central) – 29.7% (31.8% last week)

Region 7 (Tulsa County – 21.8% (22.2% last week)

Region 8 (Oklahoma County) – 33.1% (34.9% last week)

As of today, there are 5 inmates with active infection in the Lexington prisons. All are in the Joseph Harp Correctional Center.

At present, we have 2 inmates who have tested positive for COVID-19 in our jail, down from 3 last week.

There is a cumulative total of 521 (504) confirmed COVID-19 cases in Cleveland County Nursing Homes and Long Term Care Facilities. There have been 414 (380) recoveries and 64 (61) deaths. There are 43 (63) active cases, 20 fewer than last week.

The case fatality rate (CFR) in Oklahoma is 0.9% the same as last week. The CFR for the United States is currently 1.8% (2.0%).

The positivity rate in Oklahoma today is 17.24 (13.4% Last week). 48 states are currently above the recommended positivity rate (5%).

The positivity rate for the United States is 11.56 (10.4% last week) (Johns Hopkins University, 7 day average) which is 31<sup>st</sup> in the world.

### National Comparison: (all states + DC)

Total number of reported COVID-19 cases:

Oklahoma ranked 27<sup>th</sup> (25<sup>th</sup> last week) California is highest, Vermont is lowest.

Cumulative reported cased per 100,000 population:

Oklahoma ranked 24<sup>th</sup> with 5,224 cases per 100,000 population (17<sup>th</sup> last week), North Dakota is highest, Vermont is lowest.

Total deaths:

Oklahoma ranked 34<sup>th</sup> (32<sup>rd</sup> last week) Texas is highest, Vermont is the lowest.

Death rate (per 100,000):

Oklahoma is ranked 43<sup>rd</sup> (40<sup>th</sup> last week), New Jersey is highest and Vermont is the lowest.

Vaccinations in the United States have begun. The first shipment of the Pfizer vaccine arrived in Oklahoma today. Health care workers treating COVID-19

patients will be the first to be offered the vaccination, followed by high-risk individuals (LTC residents etc.).

We are moving forward with limiting public access to the Courthouse and Office Building. Everything should be in place for this Wednesday morning.
