

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MINUTES

MONDAY, JANUARY 4, 2021

Commissioner Darry Stacy led in Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Chairman Darry Stacy called to order the regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Cleveland County Commissioners at 1:00 P.M. this 4th day of January 2021, in Meeting Room 200 of the Cleveland County Office Building. Linda Atkins, Deputy County/Secretary, called the roll and those present were:

Darry Stacy, Chairman Rod Cleveland, Vice-Chairman Harold Haralson, Member Linda Atkins, Secretary

After the reading of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of December 28, 2020, and there being no additions or corrections, Harold Haralson moved that the minutes be **approved**. Darry Stacy seconded the motion.

The vote was: Darry Stacy, yes; Rod Cleveland, abstain; Harold Haralson, yes. Motion carried.

The bid term will be January 22, 2021 through July 21, 2021.

B. Items of Business:

2. Darry Stacy moved, seconded by Rod Cleveland, to Re-elect Rod Cleveland as Vice-Chairman of the Cleveland County Board of County Commissioner.

3. George Mauldin, Emergency Management Director, presented the following COVID-19 Updates and Operations within Cleveland County. As of today, there are 20,392(18,586) confirmed cases in Cleveland County with 166 (151) deaths. This is an increase of 1,806 (1,251) cases with 15 (8) additional deaths since the last Monday.

There are 9,843 (9,097) cases in Norman with 89 (83) deaths. This is an increase of 746 (451) cases with six additional deaths since the last weekly update on December 28, 2020.

There are 2,742 (2,533) active cases in Cleveland County, an increase of 209 (65) and 1,097(1,006) active cases in Norman, an increase of 91 (-90) since last Monday.

The average number of new cases in Oklahoma has increased. The current 7 day average of new cases in Oklahoma is 3,455 (2,736), 719 more than last week. In Cleveland County the 7 day average of new cases is 258 (179), up 79 since last week.

The number of deaths has increased only slightly in the past week with 169 (165) deaths recorded statewide, 4 more than the previous week.

In 2020, there were 38 weeks with excess deaths reported in Oklahoma. Not all of these deaths can be attributed to COVID-19.

Hospitalizations are near an all-time high. As of December 31, there were 1,910 (1,729) individuals hospitalized with COVID-19 with 498 (451) in the ICU. The seven day rolling average is 1,853(1,741), up 112 (52) since last week.

ICU availability continues to be low but has increased, there are 6% of ICU beds available, up from 5% last week (58 of 1,036). Available medical/surgery beds available remains at 13% (747 of 5,635), with 94% of hospitals reporting on December 31.

As of December 31, seventy six counties are in the moderate (orange) category. Harmon County is in the low (yellow) category with 10.8 new cases per 100,000 population. Cleveland County had 66.3 new cases per 100,000 population, down from 83.1 on December 24.

Woods County again has the highest rate in the state with 198.2 new cases per 100,000 population (204.7 last week). Woods County has a population of 8,793 and a total of 1,026 cases with 105 new cases in the past week.

The new cases per 100,000 population decreased in 70 counties this week.

Red trigger:

The county is located in a Region where COVID19 patients represent 40% or more of staffed beds (Acute Care OSDH licensed facilities)

Percent of beds that are COVID-19 positive by region:

Region 1 (northwest) -23.6% (18.6% last week)

Region 2 (northeast) – 37.2% (38.9% last week)

Region 3 (southwest) -30.9% (28.5% last week)

Region 4 (east central) – 23.8% (18.9% last week)

Region 5 (southeast) -24.3% (22.3% last week)

Region 6 (central) – 30.8% (27.4% last week)

Region 7 (Tulsa County – 24.3% (22.7% last week)

Region 8 (Oklahoma County) – 37.9% (35.2% last week)

As of today, there are 3 inmates with active infection in the Lexington prisons. All three in the Joseph Harp Correctional Center.

At present, we have two COVID-19 positive inmates in our jail (one last week).

There is a cumulative total of 561 confirmed COVID-19 cases in Cleveland County Nursing Homes and Long Term Care Facilities. There have been 451 recoveries and 66 deaths. There are 44 active cases, 9 fewer than last week.

The case fatality rate (CFR) in Oklahoma is 0.8%, the same as last week. The CFR for the United States is currently 1.7%, also the same as last week.

The positivity rate in Oklahoma today is 23.84% (13.63% Last week). 47 states (45 last week) are currently above the recommended positivity rate (5%).

The positivity rate for the United States is 13.78% (10.54% last week) (Johns Hopkins University, 7 day average). The U.S. is ranked 25th of 82 countries for which data is available 35th of 88 last week).

National Comparison: (all states + DC)

Total number of reported COVID-19 cases:

Oklahoma ranked 24th (24th last week) California is highest, Vermont is lowest.

Cumulative reported cased per 100,000 population:

Oklahoma ranked 14th with 7,419 (6,461) cases per 100,000 population (16th last week), North Dakota is highest, Vermont is lowest.

Total deaths:

Oklahoma ranked 33rd (33rd last week) Texas is highest, Vermont is the lowest.

Death rate (per 100,000):

Oklahoma is ranked 41st (41st last week), New Jersey is highest and Hawaii is the lowest.

Immunization Summary:

As of December 31, OSDH has received 174,900 doses of COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer and Moderna). 50,330 doses have been administered.

Classen Urgent Care has partnered with OSDH to administer vaccinations to the Sheriff's Office personnel as well as volunteer firefighters. They will also vaccinate our employees over the age of 65.
