1. P.O. repeatedly attempts to contact the client by mail, telephone, and in person by conducting home visits //for approximately 30 days.
2. P.O. checks local jails and hospitals.
3. P.O. contacts family, friends and employers requesting them to pass along the message to contact their P.O.
4. After 30 days, P.O. files a violation report to the Court requesting that a warrant be issued due to the fact that the client has gone AWOL.
5. P.O. confirms that the active warrant has been posted in NCIC. If it is not posted, P.O. writes a letter requesting that the warrant be entered into NCIC.
6. Quarterly, P.O. requests additional NCIC reports to ensure that the client has not been arrested in another town or state.

**Kandy Gillespie**

Ms. Gillespie was working on her community service hours at OCARTA. One of the ladies there told Ms. Gillespie that she loved her confidence, attitude and strong desire to share her recovery story. She asked Ms. Gillespie if she would be interested in becoming a Peer Recovery Support Specialist, and she said, yes. As a Peer Recovery Support Specialist, Ms. Gillespie will be trained to work with others on their road to recovery. She is currently attending classes twice per week and should complete with certification in 8 months. She is really excited about the program.

Ms. Gillespie – 2 previous felony 1 in Oklahoma County and 1 in Logan County – both include charges of DUI. Lives in Oklahoma County has an Interlock device on her vehicle. Has not failed one drug or alcohol test. Has just completed her first year in the Cleveland County Community Sentencing & Probation Program.


OCARTA is a non-profit organization that accommodates individuals in recovery by offering: Mentoring, Support groups and other classes such as parenting, anger management, and grief.


